Asian and African Languages and Linguistics (AALL): Guidelines for contributors of Linguistic Materials and Primary Data

Revised: May 2022

Asian and African Languages and Linguistics (AALL) invites submission of compilations of linguistic materials and primary data, as stipulated by the following rules.

- 1. Definition of 'Linguistic Materials and Primary Data': The contribution must include primary data that have been obtained by the author's own fieldwork, and its main goal is to present the data as they are (rather than to present a particular analysis or theoretical discussion on the basis of the data). Examples include grammatical sketches, word lists, or the texts of folk tales.
- 2. Opportunities for submission are open to any researcher.
- Submissions will be reviewed by two or more reviewers. Submissions that do not fit the above definition of 'Linguistic Materials and Primary Data' will be rejected prior to review.
- 4. The manuscript must be submitted as an electronic file and must be formatted according to the stylesheet as required by AALL. Authors wishing to submit a manuscript need to obtain the AALL article template file from the editorial committee office (e-mail address and URL shown below). The templates are available for Microsoft Word (97-2000 or later version) and pLaTeX2ɛ. The manuscript must be 40 or fewer pages in B5 size. The languages accepted are Japanese or English. If the author prepares the manuscript in a non-native language, please ensure that it has been proofread before submission.
- 5. In the manuscript, the title and author's name and affiliation (both in Japanese and in English in the case of a manuscript written in Japanese) must be printed on the cover page (i.e., the first page). Author's personal information, such as name, affiliation, etc., which would reveal the author's identity, must not appear elsewhere in the manuscript.
- 6. AALL only accepts unpublished original manuscripts. The submission must not have been previously published in any other academic journal and must not be simultaneously under consideration by another journal.
- 7. In consideration of the spirit of open access, a CC (Creative Commons) license will be assigned to each AALL contribution (including both featured papers and linguistic materials). As a rule, it is considered that the author(s) have agreed on the assignment of Attribution 4.0 International (CC BY 4.0) at the point of manuscript submission. Other options with regard to the types/versions of CC licenses may be permitted when there are reasonable grounds. For further information, please contact the Editorial Committee office.
