## PRIMARY OBJECTIVE

The Institute for the Study of Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa (ILCAA) is a national institution having as its primary objective the comprehensive study of the modern languages of the nations of Asia and Africa together with their historical and cultural backgrounds.

Upon recommendation of the Science Council of Japan, ILCAA was established on April 1, 1964, to be in affiliation with the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies, to serve Japanese scholarship in the humanities and social sciences as the primary academic institution in this field.

## PURPOSES AND FUNCTIONS

## The purposes of ILCAA are:

- to conduct and stimulate research pertaining to the languages and cultures of Asia and Africa;
- (2) to compile and publish dictionaries and grammars;
- to provide language instruction for the training of specialists;
- (4) to develop the study of less familiar languages;
- (5) to send scholars abroad for specialized research;
- (6) to keep in contact and to cooperate with similar research institutions in Japan and overseas; and
- (7) to perform other functions related to the objectives of the institute.

#### B) LANGUAGE TRAINING COURSES

Training in Asian and African languages is one of the most important activities of ILCAA, and was one of the primary purposes for which the institute was established. The institute has offered language training courses to students and researchers every summer since 1967. Courses in the following Asian and African languages have been offered: Bengali, Burmese (at the Osaka University of Foreign Studies), Ethiopian, Fukienese, Khmer, Korean, Modern Hebrew, Persian, Swahili, and Tibetan.

## C) OVERSEAS SCIENTIFIC EXPEDITION

One of the major functions of the institute is to conduct field research in Asia and Africa. Scientific expeditions organized by members of this institute up to the present include the following.

## COMPUTATIONAL ANALYSES OF LINGUISTIC AND CULTURAL IN-FORMATION

The institute has undertaken the mechanical processing of a large quantity of Asian and African linguistic materials to file basic data which can be utilized for diverse purposes such as historical, anthropological and sociological researches as well as phonological, lexicological, and syntactic analyses of these languages. The processing of data has already begun for Arabic, Chinese, Korean, Khmer, Swahili, Tamil, Thai, and Tibetan.

### E) SENDING RESEARCHERS OVERSEAS FOR FIELD RESEARCH

The institute sends young researchers to Asian and African countries for periods of two years in order to develop their language abilities and cultural insight in perfinent areas.
