Research Institute for Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa, as one of its activities from 2015 to 2016, has positions available for foreign researchers to work as visiting researchers (applicants must be of Professor or Associate Professor level) who will play key roles and participate in collaborative research.

#### 1. Admission Requirements

- 1) The applicants will be expected to play a key role in joint research projects by conducting research at ILCAA from 2015 to 2016. Applicants must apply to participate in a joint research project. (*Please refer to the List of Joint Research Project 2015/2016.*) New joint research projects scheduled to begin from April 2015 will be posted on the attachment as soon as they have been approved.
- 2) On completion of the research topic, applicants are required to publish their research results in the form of an article.
- 3) In principle, applicants must be a full-time researcher from an academic research organization outside Japan. Japanese nationals are eligible if they have worked as permanently employed staff for 10 years or more in an academic research organization outside of Japan.
- Applicants must possess research capabilities equivalent to that of a professor or associate professor.
- 5) Applicants should be in good health.

- The 1<sup>st</sup> term is for 7 months from September 2015 to March 2016

## 4. Terms and Conditions of Employment

- 1) Salary will be based on the regulations specified by Tokyo University of Foreign Studies.
- 2) Research funds will be provided along with office space and the use of other Institute facilities and equipment. Accommodation can be arranged at the International Hall on the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies campus.
- 3) The Social Insurance system is applicable during the time of employment.

- 5) During the employment period, foreign researchers must carry out research at ILCAA, furthermore they are required to give a presentation on collaborative research at academic meetings, and to submit reports on the achievements and results of their work. They are also strongly encouraged to submit articles to *Journal of Asian and African Studies* within one year after leaving ILCAA.

In order to apply for the position, please contact a research representative (coordinator) of the joint research project in which you wish to participate. In cases in which research representatives of joint research projects are not ILCAA staff members, it is necessary to contact the sub-coordinator who is an ILCAA staff member. After sufficient consultation concerning research plans, please state on your application form the name of the staff member (coordinator or sub- coordinator) with whom you have consulted as your host staff.

## 2) Deadline

The deadline is January 16, 2015. Applications must reach the ILCAA office by the date.

#### 3) Required Documentation

Please submit the original copies of the following documents with your application form to Research Promotion Division of ILCAA by postal mail. Only applications made in English or in Japanese will be accepted.

- ② List of research achievement (no fixed format) and 3 thesis/ publications (photocopies of articles /publications are acceptable).
- 3 A short essay stating the reasons for your choice of joint research project topic, its relevance

to your previous research, the roles that you intend to play in the chosen research project during your stay, and your plans for presentation of research results on completion (must be more than one A4-size page).

4 Letter of agreement for your application from the head or divisional head of the institution organization to which you belong. The letter must be printed on the letterhead of your institution/organization.

## 6. Selection Process and Notification of Result

Applicants will be screened on the basis of their applications only, and they will be informed of the result of their application by the end of March 2015.
