Open Position for Foreign Researcher (Visiting Researcher) Research Institute for Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa (ILCAA) Tokyo University of Foreign Studies

Research Institute for Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa, as one of its activities from 2016 to 2017, has positions available for visiting researchers (applicants must be of Professor or Associate Professor level) who will play key roles and participate in collaborative research.

1. Admission Requirements

- 1) Applicants will be expected to play a key role in joint research projects by conducting research at ILCAA from 2016 to 2017. Applicants must apply to participate in a joint research project. (*Please refer to the List of Joint Research Projects 2016/2017*) New joint research projects beginning from April 2016 will be posted on the attachment as soon as they have been approved.
- 2) On completion of the research topic, applicants are required to publish their research results in the form of an article.
- 3) In principle, applicants must be a full-time researcher from an academic research organization outside Japan. Japanese nationals are eligible if they have worked as permanently employed staff for 10 years or more in an academic research organization outside of Japan.
- Applicants must possess research capabilities equivalent to that of a professor or associate professor.
- 5) Applicants should be in good health.

2. Number of Positions

Approximately 5 researchers

3. Duration of Employment

The employment periods are as follows:

- The 1st term is for 7 months from September 2016 to March 2017
- The 2nd term is for 4 months from April 2017 to July 2017.

*Please specify which term you are applying for 1) 1^{st} term only, or 2) 2^{nd} term only. If your intended period overlaps the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} terms then specify 3) 1^{st} and 2^{nd} terms. In case of 1) or 3), please state a period of 4 months or longer.

4. Terms and Conditions of Employment

- 1) Salary will be based on the regulations specified by Tokyo University of Foreign Studies.
- Research funds will be provided as well as an office and the use of other Institute facilities and equipment. Accommodation can be arranged at the International Residence, on-campus residence.
- 3) The Social Insurance system is applicable during the time of employment.
- 4) Round-trip travel expenses are paid in accordance with regulations. Expenses for family members of researchers are not paid.
- 5) During the employment period, foreign researchers must carry out research at ILCAA, furthermore they are required to give a presentation on collaborative research at academic meetings, and to submit reports on the achievements and results of their work. They are also strongly encouraged to submit articles to *Journal of Asian and African Studies* within one year after leaving ILCAA.

5. Application

1) Prior Consultation

In order to apply for the position, you need to contact a research representative (coordinator) of the joint research project in which you plan to participate. In cases in which research representatives of joint research projects are not ILCAA staff members, it is necessary to contact the sub-coordinator who is an ILCAA staff member. After sufficient consultation concerning research plans, please state on your application form the name of the staff member (coordinator or sub- coordinator) with whom you have consulted as your host staff.

2) Deadline

The deadline is January 15, 2016. Applications must reach the ILCAA office by the date.

3) Required Documentation

Please submit the original copies of the following documents with your application form to Research Promotion Division of ILCAA by postal mail. Only applications made in English or in Japanese will be accepted.

*Please note that no submitted documents will be returned.

- a) Application form, Complete Curriculum Vitae and Employment Experience (specified format)
- b) List of research achievement (no fixed format) and 3 thesis/ publications (photocopies of articles /publications are acceptable).
- c) A short essay stating the reasons for your choice of joint research project topic, its relevance to your previous research, the roles that you intend to play in the chosen research

project during your stay, and your plans for presentation of research results on completion (must be more than one A4-size page).

d) Letter of agreement for your application from the head or divisional head of the institution organization to which you belong. The letter must be printed on the letterhead of your institution/organization.

6. Selection Process and Notification of Result

Applicants will be screened based on their applications, and they will be informed of the result of their application by the end of March 2016.
